## Juniors Selected for NJ Scholars

Delbarton students will fill 2 of 39 slots in the NJ Scholars Program held from June 22 through July 25 at the Lawrenceville School in Lawrenceville, NJ. Juniors **John Onieal** and **Brennan McCormick** will participate in the program which creates an intense intellectual experience designed to stimulate academic excellence. The topic of this summer's program is *India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh: One History. Three Countries. Shared Future.* For five weeks, the NJ Scholars will plunge into the interdisciplinary college-level summer program, taught by faculty from a wide variety of colleges and universities, as well as The Lawrenceville School.

## DELBARTON WINS PANASONIC CHALLENGE

A team of three Delbarton freshmen, **Peter Godart**, **Justin Park** and **Bud Peters**, outmaneuvered 33 high school team finalists from across New Jersey to win the 2008 Panasonic Creative Design Challenge at NJ PAC. The premier science and technology competition for New Jersey high school students, co-sponsored by the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT), tests engineering and technology skills. More than 80 high school teams took part in preliminary rounds. Delbarton dominated the annual competition with a second Delbarton team of **Michael Garrison**, **Luke Hemenetz** and **Bernie Roesler** placing third overall.

Each student member of the first place team was awarded a \$5,000 scholarship, and third place team members received \$3,000. Both teams, led by faculty advisor **Greg Devine**, designed and maneuvered a robot through a timed obstacle course. Modeling a real-world engineering process, students kept an engineering log book with their robotics designs and notes and gave an oral presentation that tested their communication skills. At a photo session in the senior garden on April 10 the suggestion was made that the boys play dueling robots, gladiator style. "We already did," reported one budding engineer. Who won? "It was a tie."

## Delbarton Arts Excel

Spring brought a crop of awards for Delbarton artists and musicians. Congratulations to the Delbarton artists who submitted their work to the 20th Annual Blackwell Street Student Art Exhibit at the Morris County Courthouse in Morristown. ## Juniors Chosen for Governor's School

Junior Guidance Counselor **Shelly Levine** announced that three Delbarton juniors, **Mark Michelli**, **Allen Shih** and **JP Zavodny**, were chosen for the Governor's School, an intensive four-week residential honors program for high school juniors held during the month of July on college campuses around the state. **Mark Michelli** will attend the Governor's School for the Arts at The College of New Jersey. 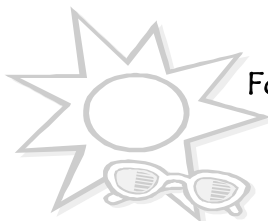

## PARTNERS IN SCIENCE

Juniors **Doug Ballanco, James Cheong** and **Ryan Mich** have been selected to participate in the challenging Partners in Science (PIS) program at the Liberty Science Center (LSC) this summer.

The program, now in its 22nd year and presented by LSC, takes students beyond textbooks by immersing them into real life science research conducted by a professional scientist; PIS runs for a full eight weeks, from June 27 through August. 23.

In early summer, students attend skill workshops that prepare them to work with their mentors. Throughout the summer, students meet at LSC for seminars presented by science professionals, career counseling, and a workshop on research paper preparation. At the end of the summer, students present their research topic to families and mentors during their final symposium.

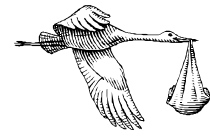

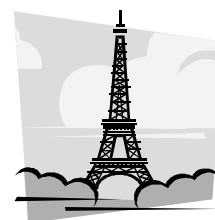

## My Kingdom for a Trebuchet

Since last Fall, a group of seniors has been building a *trebuchet* – essentially a giant sling or catapult – up on the 40-acres where new Delbarton athletic fields soon will be built. Invented in China in the 4th Century BC, the trebuchet was a popular siege engine used by Christians and Muslims alike in the 12th Century AD to smash walls or launch projectiles over them. According to Wikipedia diseased bodies were launched into cities hoping to infect those under siege, a precursor to modern day biological warfare. The *Rule of St. Benedict* prevents the Delbarton trebuchet from ever seeing action, thus Green Wave sports opponents need not fret that future Braveheart contingents will launch projectiles -- even big, fat, wobbly, green water balloons --from the Delbarton device. This novel trebuchet idea was initiated by a small group – **Bernie Roesler, Luke Hemenetz, Mike Garrison** and **Chris O'Brien** from the Class of 2008 – and, despite mentor **Mr. Greg Devine's** initial skepticism that such a large project could come together, they and others worked in earnest though the Fall, Winter and Spring – weekends and holidays mostly – and have built quite a machine. It's up on the back 40 right now and, according to eye witnesses, works beautifully. The students used a recent day off from school to refine their throwing technique and achieved some very satisfying tosses. Still, there was tweaking to be done. They report that greasing the axle, and other minor adjustments, later improved thrust and velocity. Says Mr. Devine, *"The project has a certain wonder to it arising from a combination of the improbability of success, the beauty of the site and the trebuchet itself, the hard work of the kids, the drama and thrill of the tosses and the fact that it is something of a capstone for senior year for some of these kids."*

Tom Roesler, Bernie's dad, contributed all the project materials, plus time and expertise in design and construction. Other seniors who caught the trebuchet bug -- it's contagious! -- and lent considerable time to the project included **Kyle Marra, Brien Walsh, Max Bogorad, Mike Kelly, Joe Hughes** and **Dave Smith**.

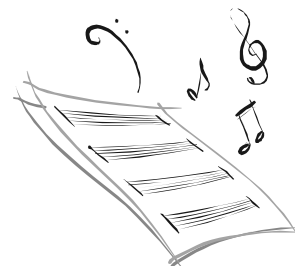
## ARTS NEWS (cont)

## Sister Charitina is Distinguished Educator

**Sister Marie Charitina Frabizio** of St. Anthony School in Elizabeth, N.J. was honored on May 28, 2008 as the school's 2008 Distinguished Educator. Headmaster Br. Paul Diveny O.S.B. presented the award, which recognizes an area educator "who has demonstrated personal and professional excellence and who has had a significant impact on young people's lives." She is a Kappa Delta Pi honoree at Seton Hall University and was a recipient of the Distinguished Service Award in Education for her professional work in Nutley, New Jersey. Among the tributes at the awards ceremony, Fr. Hilary O'Leary of St. Mary's Abbey quoted Thomas Moore in *A Man for All Seasons* who, when asked who judges the quality of a teacher, replied, "Your students. God. Not a bad audience." Sister Charitina had the "courage to enter a classroom... and reveal resources hidden in students' own minds." In accepting her award, Sister Charitina pointed out that her success as an administrator is due to her team of teachers, students and parents. She commended the Delbarton School faculty members, who witnessed the ceremony during a faculty meeting, for their hard work on behalf of their students.
